## Why We Chose This Topic:

Due to a shared interest of World War II, we decided to focus our project on an important leader in this time period. We began researching leaders around Operation Overload (D-Day) since it was a defining event of World War II. While doing so we came across the name George Marshall. We discovered that Marshall was supposed to be the original commander of the D-Day mission, but gave up this spot to Dwight Eisenhower, at the request of President Franklin Roosevelt. President Roosevelt said that he "could not sleep at night with Marshall out of DC". We became very interested in George Marshall. After doing further research, we learned of his plan to save Europe from their suffering after the war. We came to greatly admire George Marshall. ## How We Conducted Our Research:
